

⁴⁹ And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised, so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." ⁵⁰ Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. ⁵¹ While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. ⁵² And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, ⁵³ and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

Luke also tells this story in the beginning of the book Acts of the Apostles 1: 6-9

⁶ So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." ⁹ When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

Many churches celebrate Ascension Day with special feasts – at one point various kinds of fowl or birds were consumed to celebrate Jesus "flying" into heaven. In other areas, many different kinds of fruit are eaten celebrating Jesus' passing on the earthly ministry to the apostles, the first fruits of the new church. Celebrations can include pastries filled with a "cloud-like" cream, as Jesus was taken up into the clouds.



Jesus' ascension into heaven marks the end of his earthly ministry, and the beginning of our ministries as followers of Jesus. In about 10 days, we will celebrate Pentecost – the birthday of the church – the day that promises Jesus made in Luke 24:49 and Acts 1:8 are fulfilled – the day the church receives the gift of the Holy Spirit. Over 3,000 became believers on that day.

The Ascension of Christ is Thursday, May 9, this year. Many Catholic congregations will celebrate this day with a special Mass, other "high churches," may also have special services. But no special service is required to commemorate Jesus' ascension; the day Jesus gave the responsibility of loving God and loving our neighbors back to us. In the same way we celebrate communion as a remembrance, eat some chicken, or go outside and stare up at the clouds in the sky. Whatever you choose to do, take a few minutes on Thursday to remember and thank Jesus.

GOD, NOAH AND THE ANIMALS












